
FIGHTING AGAINST GENDER STEREOTYPES

GIVING TO Α CHANCE **EVERYONE**

IECD and its partner schools make every effort to facilitate access to our training for young people disadvantaged. On the 24th of March 2018, the Open House Day at HOTEC was an opportunity to introduce the approximately program to 1,700 students. On April 13, the IECD discussed with NGOs, local and international shelters and orphanages about the difficulties in accessing education for young people and the solutions proposed by the IECD. Indeed, a fees advance system has been implemented to facilitate the access to the training and to avoid drop-out for financial reasons.

SECURING TECHNICAL LABS

Work accidents are still very common in Vietnam. That's why the IECD has provided our partner schools with digital measuring devices and personal protective equipment for students and teachers. In this context, electrical safety training was to 21 teachers provided thanks to the support of the Schneider Electric Teachers program.
