
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




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MOROCCO


LEBANON

Digitalization of training content and adaptation to distance learning

In Lebanon, which is currently facing a major health and economic crisis, schools are still closed. IECD decided to adapt and put all its developina distance energy in (workshops digitalization and creation interactive presentations). The teachers of the electrotechnical and industrial maintenance specialties were equipped with cameras to facilitate the production of technical drawings and diagrams.

The GET program, which assists guidance and employment offices (GEO) in Lebanon **updated the guidance and employment guide**. This new version clarifies the competencies needed by the GEO staff as well as their 3 main missions: promotion of vocational training, educational and vocational guidance, and employment support. It will also complete the list of tools available for the GEOs and for IECD to train the GEO officers.





CONGO

Finalization of the survey about the needs in competences of the companies

To better understand the skill needs of the structures hosting the trainees and graduates of the Don Bosco Center in Pointe Noire, IECD conducted a survey among 45 companies and 66 craftsmen operating in the fields of automotive mechanics, general mechanics, welding and industrial maintenance. Following this survey, IECD organized a Work Situation Analysis workshop, which led to the precise description of the occupation of technician in automobile mechanics, a preliminary step to updating the curriculum.
